

BOARD MEETING

MAY 5, 2015

Members present: Janet Mitchell, President, Dorothy Patton, Sue Clark, Debbie Ragains, Debbie Ramo, Cathy Duke, Beth Murena, Jane Haggard, Carol Whitton, Diana Van Riel, and Paula Maldonado.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Janet Mitchell. Thanks to Debbie Ragains and Diana Van Riel for their hospitality tonight.

I<sup>st</sup> Vice President/ Program Chairman Sue Clark reported that Robin Mani would be teaching the project in the meeting in May and Heidi Allison would be teaching in June.

2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President/ Membership Chairman Deb Ramo reported that we now have 65 members. She will put the names and addresses of the new members in the newsletter.

Secretary Jane Haggard presented the minutes from the April Board Meeting and asked for additions or corrections. None were made and a motion to accept the minutes as presented was made by Sue Clark and seconded by Cathy Duke and passed. Jane also asked for some more sign-ups to work a demo slot at the San Bernardino County Fair. She will also have the sign up sheets at the next general meeting.

Treasurer Cathy Duke presented the Treasurers' Report through April. Beth Murena made a motion to accept the report as presented and the motion was seconded by Jane Haggard and passed.

Newsletter Chairman Beth Murena asked that all articles for the newsletter be in by Friday.

Chris Blunk has volunteered to take the position of Ways and Means Chairman for the rest of the year. Thanks Chris.

Website Chairman Carol Whitten asked that we use landscape layout to send her anything we would like posted on the website.

Christmas Party Co-Chairman Paula Maldonado reported there are only 3 sign-ups' to decorate tables for the Christmas Party. Discussion was held concerning forming a committee to do decorations by June if no more sign-ups'. Discussion was held about activities at the party. Sue Clark reported that she would take care of the wreath for Wounded Warriors. Jane Haggard volunteered to bring the door prize. The party chairpersons are responsible for the raffle items, the door prize, the servers, and the tickets. 2<sup>nd</sup> chance items are the responsibility of the Ways and Means committee.

Under new business Jane Haggard reported that someone dropped a lot of paint on a chair at the last meeting and did not clean it up. By the next morning it was dry and took a lot of work to get it off. She asked that painters please clean up paint that they might spill before it dries.

Motion to adjourn meeting was made by Beth Murena and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jane Haggard at 8:40 p.m. and passed.

The key to success with your Sta-Wet Palette is the proper preparation of the palette. Follow these 5 steps to insure great results every time!

1) Prepare the Sta-Wet Acrylic paper by placing a sheet of Master-son's acrylic paper in the sink and turn on the HOT water. Do not use the sink stopper; let the water drain over the paper and out of the sink.. Allow the hot water to run directly onto the paper for 45-60 seconds. The paper will become semi-transparent

2) Wet the sponge. The sponge material has been compressed. Once you moisten it with water, it will expand to 1/4" thickness. The first time you use the sponge, rinse it thoroughly to remove any adhesives used during the processing of the sponge. Doing so will extend the life of the sponge. Then, fully saturate the sponge with COLD water. DO NOT WRING OUT THE SPONGE. Place the wet sponge in the palette tray. If the sponge is too large for the tray when it is wet, wring the sponge out and trim it to fit with a pair of scissors. Then saturate the sponge again with cold water and lay it in the tray.

3) Place a wet piece of Sta-Wet Acrylic palette paper on top of the sponge and use a paper towel of soft doth to wipe off the excess moisture from the top surface of

the paper.

4) **Place your paints on the paper.** The paints will slowly absorb moisture from the sponge, through the paper. Darker paint colors may bleed back into the sponge. Simply wash out the sponge when your project is completed. The paper is strong and will not easily tear, even if a palette knife is used.

5) When you have finished painting, place the lid on the tray, making sure the lid is properly sealed, and your paint will remain fresh for many days.

#### Helpful Hints for using Your Masterson Sta-Wet Palette

1) If you paint often and anticipate that you will be changing your palette paper often, you can place several sheets of paper that have been prepared according to direction in #1 above into a jar of **COLD** water and leave them indefinitely. In this way, you will always have a fresh, fully saturated piece of palette paper ready when you need it.

2) If you are painting in very hot, dry or windy conditions, evaporation of the water from the sponge may occur. If you notice the edges of the paper beginning to dry, add some water to your sponge. DO NOT LET THE PAPER COMPLETELY DRY OUT

**BEFORE REHYDRATING.** To re-hydrate the sponge and paper, lift up the paper and sponge together at one corner and pour some water into the tray. Gently tip the tray back and forth to distribute the water evenly. Use your fingers to press down any dry sports on the paper onto the sponge.

**3) While the lid fits snugly onto the tray the seal is not watertight.** When transporting your palette, you should lift the paper off the sponge, gently wring out most of the water from the sponge and place the sponae and oaoer back into the trav. With the lid on, there does not need to be as much water in the sponge because water will not evaporate with the lid securely in place. To contain water spillage during transport a Ziplock bag may be used.

4) If mildew or unpleasant odors are a problem, use distilled water to moisten the sponge, or you may add 1/4 teaspoon of ammonia to a basin of water and use to wet the sponge. Ammonia will not affect the paper, the sponge or your paints.
