As you know, we currently support the Bundles of Hope, a program run by Today's Woman Foundation. The Bundles of Hope are boxes, many decorated by our members, in support of newly diagnosed Cancer patients.

Today's Woman Foundation is now supporting the Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) which has been organized with St. Mary's Medical Center in Apple Valley. It is unfortunate that a program of this sort is necessary, but we live in an imperfect world. The purpose of this program is as follows:

"At this critical moment, we believe no survivor should walk out of a hospital feeling lost and exposed. That's why we are launching the Hope & Healing Care Bag Program—a simple yet profound way to restore dignity, provide comfort, and offer a sign of hope to survivors of sexual assault.

Each care bag includes new clothing, toiletries, and essential items—small but powerful gestures that remind survivors:

- You are not alone.
- You are cared for.
- Your healing journey starts here."

Rather than ask members to contribute items, we would invite you to visit the Today's Woman Foundation website, https://todayswomanfoundation.org/ where you can contribute to the cost of items required for their Hope and Healing Bags. Your donation does not need to be large—if you thought about spending \$5 on toiletries, instead donate the \$5, thus eliminating the need to deliver, or worse yet mail, your donation. Today's Women can use your entire donation for items that are most needed.

Please understand this will not eliminate the Bundles of Hope Boxes, which this club has sponsored for several years. The members of this club have enough love in their hearts to support two worthwhile and important causes, both overseen by an organization well known to us. This new program allows those who are unable to paint boxes to participate in the club's charity with a simple and small donation.



Saving Money on Painting Supplies: Creative Uses for Old Brushes

With the recent news that Joann is closing its doors, many of us have likely stopped by in search of good deals from their clearance sales. In light of this, I wanted to revisit a favorite topic—saving money on art supplies.

One area where costs can add up quickly is with paintbrushes. Artists often encounter split or worn-out brushes that seem unusable, but before you toss them out, consider repurposing them. Surprisingly, these "damaged" brushes can serve new functions and even mimic specialty brushes quite well.

For instance, if you're looking for a deerfoot stippler to create snow textures in your paintings, there's no need to rush out and buy one. An old, split brush can be transformed into a deerfoot by trimming the bristles at an angle. Because it's already worn and uneven, it creates a similar effect—perfect for that stippled, snowy look.

Another great example is the dry brush technique. Many people believe that you need a specific kind of brush for dry brushing, but through experience, I've learned that it's not about the brush—it's about the amount of paint on it. A worn brush actually works better in this case. By trimming the bristles shorter, the brush holds less paint and naturally creates that desired, scratchy texture. The split bristles also lend themselves well to scripting motions, making them ideal for adding fine detail or texture.

Repurposing old brushes not only saves you money, but also reduces clutter and makes travel easier—especially if you attend art conferences or workshops. Fewer brushes mean less weight and space taken up in your art kit.

I hope you find these tips helpful and feel inspired to look at your old tools in a new light! Until next time...Cecilia

Yummy Recipes

Bonnie's Casserole from Terri Mullins

8 oz package of noodles or macaroni shells

- 1 lb ground hamburger
- 1 onion
- 1 green pepper
- 1 can creamed corn
- 2 cans tomato soup
- 18 oz can tomato sauce
- 1 small jar of green olives
- 1 tsp chili powder
- 1/4 tsp dry mustard powder
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp pepper
- 1 bag of grated cheese

Cook Pasta.

Brown meat with onion and green pepper.

In a bowl, mix meat with corn, tomato soup, tomato sauce, olives, salt, pepper, chili powder, and mustard powder.

Put into casserole dish and bake 30 minutes at 350 degrees.

Sprinkle grated cheese on top.

Back another 5 minutes to melt cheese

Notes: If you make it the day before and refrigerate it, you will need about 20 extra minutes in

the oven to get it thoroughly hot. I used 1 ½ of the small jars of olives. I have previously replaced the ground beef with turkey to cut the calories. Still good!
