

At this month's Desert Quail membership meeting, Judy Coates taught the most adorable Christmas Owl. During the class, she mentioned her technique for "Snowman Building". Since many of us had not heard or seen her method, I decided to include it as this month's Education article. Hope you enjoy it and find it useful as it's that time to paint snowmen.

Palette - Decoart Americana: Bleached Sand, Lamp Black, Payne's Gray, Snow White, Tuscan Red and Tangelo Orange

"I paint all my Snowmen the same way. I use a Lowe Cornell ½" Crescent Brush and a Liner Brush. Hold the Crescent Brush at an angle so that you only are loading one side with Bleached Sand—you will be dry brushing so you need NO WA-TER and very little paint. After loading the brush, tap or gently wipe off onto a paper towel to pull a little of the extra paint off the brush.

Hold your brush at an angle and with a light touch begin applying paint to the surface either in a circular motion or little "x"s. Start with a very light touch in the brightest areas (these are areas that are not shaded). As you work, you can give more pressure as needed. Keep dry brushing towards the shadow areas. Even if you think you are running out of color—you will be leaving a light powdery color and that is what you want as you head towards the shaded areas.

When your brush runs out of color, reload the same way and again start back in the brightest area working towards the shaded area. Each time you do this, your color will become brighter in each area. Repeat this as needed until you are happy with the color. Remember this is snow so you want it to look fluffy! It usually takes 3 or 4 coats to get the color where you want it. When doing this, be sure to let the first coat dry before continuing or your color will lift. You could also add a little stippling as you proceed. Next dry brush or stipple on a little Snow White for a highlight.

If you get the paint too heavy in the shadow areas, side load a 3/4" flat (very lightly) in Payne's Gray (or if you have used a different blue on your background, you can use that color) and reinforce your shades. You don't want this reinforcement to get too heavy—it still needs to look fluffy.

Snowman Faces: All faces are done the same with the exception of the nose shape or eye shapes.

Cheeks: Drybrush with Tuscan Red. Remember to start with light pressure-proceed until you get the color you want.

Eyes: Very simple!! Use your liner—load into thinned Black. Starting on the tip of your brush, paint short little strokes to form somewhat of a triangle or you may just wish to dip dot the eyes Black.




