
Becky and Rosanne will be taking sign ups for tables for our very successful Holiday Boutique, I hope you are all painting for this. If you don't think

# **Local artist shows off** painting at East Coast gallery

APPLE VALLEY — Artist Dorothy Patton said she was honored when the Stonewall Gallery in Cambridge Springs, Pennsylvania accepted one of her paintings to be showcased.

The self-taught artist from Apple Valley said the gallery's "Lily Juried Art Show" has decided feature Patton's painting that depicts a walk along a path through lilies that grew wild on the 81-acre country farm where she lived as a child.

"I grew up in the small town of Albion, Pennsylvania," said Patton, 73, a retired high school teacher who began painting

after she was given a One Stroke painting kit. "Painting flowers has always helped me to relax."

Patton, who gives free art lessons at her church, said painting the country scene was a pleasure as fond memories from her childhood flashed across her mind.

"That path (depicted in the painting) sprang from my heart and mind when I first heard about the gallery," Patton said. "I used to walk the path or ride my horse bareback down the narrow way. Many times, I would pick and smell the lovely lilies. It was another place and time."

Patton, who was born without the lower half of her left arm, said she began painting about six years ago. She started by painting flowers and was inspired to move to landscapes.

Patton, who met her future husband, Roger, in the sixth grade, said they moved to Arizona in 1965 and to California two years later.

"We both taught in the little town of McFarland for about a year," Patton said. "He taught history and geography, and I taught English and reading. Most of our kids came from poor families who worked in the fields, with many students coming to school without shoes. We loved working with those kids."

The town of McFarland was featured in Walt Disney Pictures "McFarland, USA," a film based on the true story of a 1987 cross country team from a predominantly Mexican-American high school.

Patton said she misses the country life of Pennsylvania, but not the bitter cold of its winters. She also said her prosthetic left arm didn't do well in the cold.

#### HOW TO CRACKLE PAINT

There are many answers to your question of how to crackle paint. First you need to decide what sort of effect you want.

Are you looking to imitate old flaking paint? Do you want to coat a painting or surface with a delicate transparent crazing? Or maybe the look of old cracked wood interests you.

#### **GOLDEN CRACKLE PASTE**

In this detail of a larger painting, we used Crackle Paste manufactured by GOLDEN.

This is a very thick medium that goes on and remains opaque after drying.

It's been formulated so that as the medium dries it creates deep fissures and cracks.

It is not recommended that this medium be speed-dried. A thick application will require days to dry.

The heavier the application, the bigger the cracks.

Applied thinly the medium cracks lightly or not at all.

It's best to use this product on a rigid surface because of the extreme shrinking that occurs. Priming the surface with a couple or coats of Gesso is recommended to ensure good adhesion.

The crackle medium is absorbent which makes it ideal for applying washes of colors. We did many layers of washes and pours of thinned paint to create the example. The cracks filled with color.

You can also tint this medium with GOLDEN Heavy Body and Fluid Acrylic paints up to 10% by volume.

You can also add Gel Medium which seems to increase the adhesion. A good addition if an want to use it on canvas. Again, no more then 10% addition by volume.
