





We are also looking for monitors for each day. 2-3 a day. By being a monitor you will receive the pattern and instructions for the day you monitor and a goody bag too. Monitors help set up/clean up, help with the meals and just help out. You will be able to see and listen to Laurie teach also.

Brush-up on Classroom Etiquette

With our Summer Seminar coming up it seemed like a good time to review our behavior to assure all attendees get the most out of each monthly meeting and seminar.

We all like to socialize a bit, but do not talk when the teacher is talking. Others around you need to hear what the teacher is saying.

Be on time. In your seat, ready to paint when the teacher begins. It is discourteous to the teacher and those around you to drag in your bags and set up after class has begun

Turn your cell phone **OFF** if possible but definitely on "**silent**" and step outside the room **Before** you answer or make a call. Remember how much more you got from a class years ago when no one had a cell phone?

Be mindful of those around you. Don't allow your painting area to overflow into other painter's space. Make sure your totes and bags are not spilling into the aisles so that people (especially teachers) can move through the rows.

You may be sitting with an experienced friend or your regular teacher and it is perfectly fine to ask her an occasional question. However, you (and those around you) have paid to learn something from the one at the front of the room and you can't do that if you are talking over the teacher.

Most of the old rules still apply - think how you would like to be treated if you were the one teaching the class and act accordingly

Glass Stain

Information from DECOART Website

DecoArt now has a transparent stain for using on glass or plastics. This is a high quality stain that can be used on ceramics also. There are 12 colors to use as you create your design. Each color dries to a glossy finish.

As you prepare your surface, wash the surface with hot soapy water. Remove any stickers or price tags that are on the glass. It is best if you remove all soapy residue with warm water and dry with a soft lint free paper towel or cloth.

As you prepare to paint your glass be sure to leave it clear of fingerprints or smudges. It would be best to wipe it with rubbing alcohol to clean the surface of any residue.

You can use the stain for **Leading** by using a brush or the tip of the bottle. It is best if you use a consistent pressure to make a thick line while leading. Let this dry for 24 hours on a flat surface

As your fill in the spaces be sure that the stain touches the leading and the section that you just stained is covered because as the stain dries it may pull away from the leading. You can mix the colors with a toothpick to make an interesting affect. Try adding drops of stain in a certain area and using toothpick swirl the colors together.

One of the best things is that cleaning up is easy. While there may be some paint that you may want to remove just use a wet brush, toothpick or paper towel to gently wipe off the excess wet paint. You can also remove a large area of wet paint by soaking the item in warm water. If the paint is dry you can use a razor to scrape or trim the imperfection.
