The meeting was called to order by the President, Carol Whitton, at 6:00 pm.

**President:** Carol opened the meeting thanking everyone for coming out and mentioned the change from traditional potlucks to a dessert-only potluck. She also noted the other changes implemented for 2019 such as Ways & Means and potentially changing the Board meetings from night-time meetings to day-time meetings due to lack of meeting venues available. Lastly she introduced new members in attendance as well as guests.

**Treasurer:** Marilyn also noted the changes implemented for 2019 were put in place to allow our teachers to have additional, adequate “teaching” time. She then presented the 2019 budget noting an out-of-balance situation which would allow the chapter to “give back” to the membership some of the monies collected over past years and carried forward from 2018 (\$9,228.29). **The motion to approve the budget as presented was made by Rosanne Scholey and seconded by Janet Mitchell; motion passed.**

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President:** Janet Mitchell distributed the 2019 membership booklets to those members in attendance. She will continue to update the membership listing as new members join our group.

**Ways and Means:** Diana Van Riel announced the evening’s raffle prizes for Ways and Means and thanked those bringing items for the raffle. She will sell tickets throughout the early part of the class for these baskets. Ways and Means raffles will now be held during the months of January, February, April, May, July, August, October and November. On the months where the Ways and Means raffle is not held, we will hold a Quail Eggs raffle.

**Christmas Party:** Heidi Allison noted that this year’s party will be a “mystery” paint-in similar to the one she did a few years ago for Palms to Pines Painters. The location will be at the Sun View Plaza on Hesperia Road; the date will be December 7, 2019; and the cost will most likely be \$25 per member which includes everything—lunch, surface, teacher and gift.

**Community Service:** Diana Van Riel had nothing to report at this time.

**Easter Egg Exchange:** Debbie Ragains presented this year’s Easter Egg exchange surface—a 5x7 canvas. If you want to participate in this exchange, contact Debbie as the exchange will take place at the March Chapter meeting.

**Hospitality:** Annette introduced the night’s “dessert” bar. She also asked if some could stay and help with clean-up of the facility after the class was completed.

**Quail Eggs:** Kelly Costello was sick tonight; however, the Quail Eggs raffle will now be held every third month (March, June, and September).

**Summer Seminar:** Rosanne distributed flyers for this year's seminar with photos of the pieces to be done. More information will be given as the event draws closer.

**Sunshine:** Sue introduced those having birthdays this month, as well as those needing some "sunshine" as they deal with illness.

**Newsletter Editor:** Carol mentioned the newsletter had been distributed and if you did not receive it to notify her or Beth Murena.

**Website:** Carol stated the website updates for 2019 information have been completed.

**Present:**

Sue Clark, Shirley Golding, Marilyn Hinman, Terri Mullin, Nancy Schatz (via telephone), Rosanne Scholey, Catherine Schinhofen, Diana Van Riel, and Carol Whitton.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Carol Whitton, at 6:11 pm.

**President:** Carol had distributed previously and wanted to review the Society of Decorative Painters "Code of Ethics for Chapters". Our Bylaws state that we will adhere to this Code of Ethics and the key points she stressed were promoting a friendly chapter environment, having a positive and open attitude and keeping lines of communication open. To continue to allow Desert Quail Tolers to be a strong, growing chapter everyone must be willing to work together and respect each other. While she would prefer not to "bring out the gavel", we will follow Robert's Rules of Order and if it is needed she has and will implement use of a gavel to maintain respect for each other's potentially differing opinions.

**1<sup>st</sup> Vice President:** Rosanne mentioned sign-ups are improving for upcoming projects and should anyone have any suggestions on what she and Heidi could do to help, it would be greatly appreciated.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President:** Janet was not able to attend the meeting, but did report that we currently have 53 members of which two are brand new to the chapter. Rosanne noted that while we do have a large number of members, many of those live outside an easy commute to our meeting place and she would like to know how many of the 53 live within a radius of 100 miles. Catherine shared that she'd done a little research using our 2018 directory. Of those listed in our book 27 were from the High Desert area, 17 were from out of the area but within the Inland Empire area, and 7 were from out of state. Last year we averaged at or around 27 participants per meeting. It was determined we are doing pretty well with that average.

**Secretary:** Nancy reviewed the January Board meeting minutes; two recommended revisions were noted—Sue Clark's name was incorrectly documented in the "Present" list and Tami Carmody's name was misspelled. **A motion was made by Rosanne Scholey and seconded by Diana Van Riel to approve the minutes with these two corrections. Motion passed.**

**Treasurer:** Marilyn reviewed the January 2019 Treasurers Report. **A motion was made by Rosanne Scholey and seconded by Diana Van Riel to approve the report as presented; motion passed.**

**Newsletter Editor:** Elizabeth Murena was not able to attend the meeting, but Carol did note newsletter articles are due to her by February 8, 2019 (February newsletter) and March 8, 2019 (March newsletter).

**Ways and Means:** Diana Van Riel reported there had been some confusion about whether we would have Ways and Means in February and as such she had no one signed up yet. Volunteers immediately responded and Marilyn Hinman will be the Featured Artist with Rosanne Scholey and Catherine Schinhofen donating baskets.

**Charities:** No report as Linda Howard was not at the meeting.

**Christmas Party:** No report.

**Community Service:** Diana Van Riel had nothing to report at this time.

**Easter Egg Exchange:** No report.

**Education:** Kim was not at the meeting, but Carol reported that she had submitted her February newsletter article for Education.

**Fair:** Catherine reported she would be passing out Fair booklets at the February meeting and that entries will be taken from now until April 12, 2019. Catherine also asked if anyone was interested in volunteering to help with the Chapter's booth at the Fair to please let her know as soon as possible.

**Holiday Boutique:** Becky noted she really had nothing new to report on the Boutique except that she did have an out-of-state artist selling this year.

**Hospitality:** No report.

**Nominations:** No report.

**October Painting Month:** No report

**Quail Eggs:** Kelly was not at the meeting, but Carol did mention she had talked with Kelly and she was in total support of rotating Quail Egg raffles with Ways and Means to eliminate the competition between the two raffles.

**Special Raffles:** No report.

**Summer Seminar:** The projects for the Summer Seminar have been selected and the cost will be \$150 for members "in good standing as of January 2019" for both days; \$75 for one day. Sign-ups to non-members will begin on May 1, 2019 at a cost of \$175 for two days; \$90 for one day.

**Sunshine:** Sue reported she had talked with Barbara Underwood and the surgery to remove all the hardware in her knee has been scheduled. Cards or phone calls would truly be appreciated. Sue also noted that Linda Howard's mother had passed away and cards to her would be appreciated as well.

**Website:** Carol said the changes noted at the last meeting have been made and information on the Summer Seminar has been posted. If the Committee working on the Seminar would send her the flyer in pdf format, she would post that as well.

**Welcome:** No report; but Carol did mention that Donna Nelson has agreed to take responsibility for this task.

**Old Business:**

**Board Meetings—Day or Evening:** Discussion was held regarding whether our Board meetings should be in the evenings or changed to day time meetings. Since the majority of our Board members no longer work and most no longer like being out on the road late in the evening that we should try our next meeting during the day. **A motion was made by Marilyn Hinman and seconded by Rosanne Scholey to have the next meeting at 11:00 am on April 2, 2019. Motion carried.** Carol will try to secure Molly's as a meeting location and will confirm with all once she has that done.

**Ways and Means vs. Quail Egg Schedule:** Discussion was held about rotating Ways and Means and Quail Egg raffles with Ways and Means being two months in a row and Quail Eggs being the third month each quarter. For example Ways and Means would be July and August of 2019 with Quail Eggs then taking place in September. **A motion was made by Rosanne Scholey and seconded by Marilyn Hinman to approve this change; motion carried.**

**New Business:**

**Brainstorming to Increase General Meeting Attendance and Participation:** Carol started the discussion, but then turned it over to Catherine as she had some really great ideas for promoting meeting attendance and Committee/Board participation in DQT. Of the many ideas presented by Catherine, some of the main ones were approaching high schools/local colleges/senior centers and invite some of their students/residents to attend our meetings and boutique; offering to mentor new painters and to give them a "starter" kit of paint supplies to help with the initial investment needed. Also, creating a flyer of some type that could be distributed in the Today's Woman Foundation boxes or hung in various locations that would help with getting the word out on our chapter and what we do. The end result of the discussion was the creation of a new "ad hoc" "Member Recruitment Committee" chaired by Catherine with the sole purpose of increase membership and participation in our chapter.

The next Board meeting will be held April 2, 2019 at 11:00 am. The place to be confirmed at a later date.

**A motion was made by Marilyn Hinman and seconded by Rosanne Scholey to adjourn the meeting at 7:27 pm. Motion passed.**
