It's time to start thinking about painting those ornaments and goodies for the upcoming Holiday Boutique. Most of the ornaments are for Christmas with the most popular color used being RED and we all know how hard it is to get red to cover and sometimes it requires multiple coats. Try putting a coat of celery green or mustard seed on your project first.... Before the red. Then when dry add the color or red desired and you should not need quite as many coats to cover.

Also remember to try out products such as Snowtex, Opal Dust, or good old glitter on your holiday projects... it will give a sparkle to the piece and cover up those little mishaps easily and with pizzaz! Just remember to apply these products AFTER varnishing your piece. If you put them on before, the varnish can dull the finish of the glitter or sparkle and you will not be as happy with the end result.

Now get busy

And start painting those pieces to sell— you will be so happy with the money you can make.


