While reading a magazine from Our Healthy Circles.com I came across these ideas that might help on those days.

We know that aches and pains from arthritis eases with regular exercise. Daily arthritic pains may make your daily tasks difficult. Along with walking or a gym workout try these tips.

Bring your own-Carry a small pair of scissors to handle tearing jobs, such as opening ketchup packets.

Get a Grip-Add a key ring to zippers to give hands better leverage to pull up and down.


