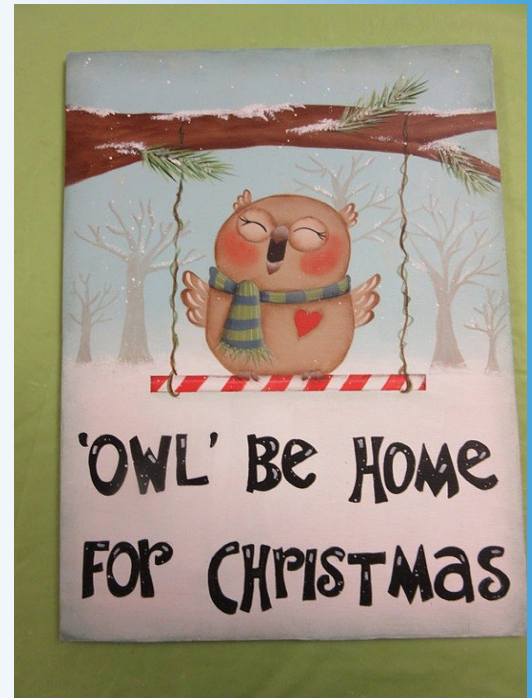

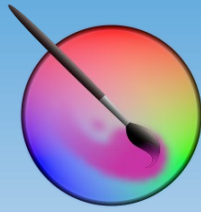

The Fun of Making and Using Chalk Paint

Not long ago our town Art Council had a project to raise funds and asked members to paint chairs that they could auction off. They had some old chairs that had been donated or you could use one that you might have.

I picked a chair, hoping that it would not need much prepping because time was an essence.

I bought the Chalky paint and really enjoyed painting my chair. I experimented by using Chalky Paint as the base and then acrylic and/or chalky paint for the decoration or details.

I know that the Chalky Paint was expensive but I liked the look of the paint on these chairs. Chalk paint got its name because it covers a surface with a soft, chalky sheen that gives the wood a nice antique look. It dries quickly and can be sanded to give it a nice distressed look.

I found on the Home and Garden Web site three ways to make Chalk Paint. Here are three of the most popular paint recipes.

Plaster of Paris Chalk Paint Recipe

- 1 cup of latex paint
- 1-1/2 tablespoons of water
- 2 -1/2 tablespoons of Plaster of Paris

Baking Soda Chalk Paint Recipe

- 1 cup of latex paint
- 3 tablespoon of cool water
- 1/2 cup of baking soda

Unsanded Grout Chalk Paint Recipe

- 1-cup latex paint
- 1 tablespoon of cool water
- 2 tablespoon of unsanded grout

Tips for using Chalk Paint

Mix the unsanded ground, baking soda or Plaster of Paris with water well enough to remove all lumps.

Make sure that the paint is as smooth as when you started. At first it will appear as smooth as the latex with which you started but as it dries you will notice the distress look.

Remember as it dries, it will dry quickly.

For a quart of paint, quadruple the amount.

TIME TO RESERVE YOUR BOUTIQUE TABLE

I am now taking reservations for your table at the holiday boutique. Tables are \$35 for two days plus 10% of sales. The dates are: Friday, Oct. 27 from 9 to 4 and Saturday, Oct. 28 from 9 to 3. Set-up is Thursday, Oct. 26 from 4 to 7. It's fun and a great way to make a little money and share our love of painting. You can also rent a half a table. You do not have to be present during the sale. **NEW FOR THIS YEAR:** Non-members will pay an additional \$15 for racks, stands, or trees (up to 2 ft.) that are not on the table.

All levels of painting are welcome. Just finish the backs with paint or stain, we want to promote decorative painting. We sell all kinds of things at our boutique-it just has to be hand made by you, so if you have another talent we'd love to see it. We also rent tables to outside vendors, so if you have a friend who might like to have a table please share my name and number. Non-members pay \$40 per table and 10% of sales for two days. We reserve tables for members thru July and start renting to non-members in August.

We hold the boutique at the Community Church at Jess Ranch on Apple Valley Rd, A.V. Rosanne and I will be happy to answer any questions and help in any way we can. **New painters are always welcome.**

We can set up or take down for you as long as we know in advance. We hope you all will take at least half a table-we send out over 600 flyers to our customers plus advertise in the Daily Press so we have the customers now we need to fill their needs!! So start painting two of whatever you paint and you'll be ready in no time. Come join us. You can call with your reservation, sign-up at the July meeting or e-mail us.

I. ORGANIZATION

2. CONTACTS/DQT OFFICERS

President: Janet Mitchell

3. ALERTS

The emergency signal for each emergency (e.g. earthquake, fire, general evacuation) is the sound of the Faith Lutheran Church building fire alarm and/or verbal announcement by DQT Officer(s) listed above.

4. 4. PROCEDURE

In the event of fire or other emergency, the fire alarm will be activated. All building occupants shall immediately evacuate the building in an orderly manner except for Evacuation Warden (see #8). A DQT Officer will notify emergency response agency by dialing 911, and will provide details to 911 Operator re: the nature of the emergency.

5. ROUTES, EXITS

In the event of an emergency necessitating evacuation, all building occupants shall evacuate the building by means of the nearest available EXIT. The locations of all emergency exits, fire extinguishers, fire alarm stations, and assembly area will be made known to DQT members via verbal safety announcement during a general meeting on an annual basis.

6. 6. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

In the event of fire, individuals trained in the use of portable fire extinguishers may use this equipment to attempt to extinguish an INCIPIENT stage fire before evacuating.

7. OPERATIONS

Should the building be deemed unsafe to occupy by authorities, DQT Officers will convey to membership the logistical details re: future DQT Chapter meetings.

8. 8. DUTIES

The role of Evacuation Warden is currently assigned to DQT member, Catherine Schinhofen. When safe, the Evacuation Warden shall perform these duties:

- a. make a final sweep of the restrooms, lobby, kitchen, adjacent rooms, etc.
- b. retrieve first aid kit for use at the designated assembly area
- c. ensure building doors are closed upon being the last person to exit
- d. inform future new members & guests of the emergency action plan

9. DESIGNATED ASSEMBLY AREA

After emergency evacuation, building occupants will gather at the far west end of parking lot. Assessment of injuries and provision of first aid can be conducted in the assembly area.

10. 10. ACCOUNTING

After emergency evacuation, the procedure for accounting of DQT members can be accomplished by roll call using the DQT member sign-in sheet and/or by simply asking, "Are your Tablemates here?"

11. NOTES

Emergency Action Plan (EAP) initially drafted and submitted by DQT member, Catherine Schinhofen on 08/04/2015 and revised on 05/03/2017. The EAP will be evaluated and updated by C. Schinhofen as needed, then submitted to DQT Officers for review. The EAP will be conveyed to the DQT membership by publishing in the DQT newsletter and/or by verbal announcement at a future

DQT chapter meeting.
