PRESIDENTS MESSAGE—Janet Mitchell

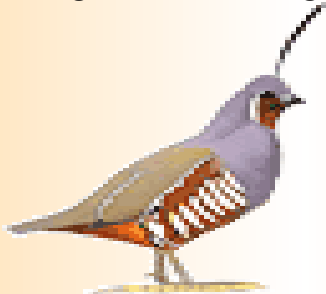

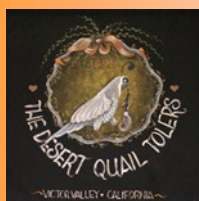

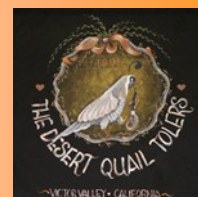

The A-B-C's of Varnishing



Many of us have varnished our projects forever, and by now we never think about how we learned to do this so well. I don't remember when I was learning to paint how I learned about varnishing. I think it was just by listening to others about their technique and/or successful ideas for varnishing.

I was clearing out some of the many painting books that have accumulated over the years. I came across an article in the Painting World, October 2011. This was a column by Kathi Hanson. I thought this was interesting and surely useful to those who were like me, those who learned by trial and error about varnishing.

Position artwork slightly titled or straight up and down. Do not place your artwork flat, as the varnish will not apply evenly.

Take your time. Always use thin, multiple coats instead of one thick coat, and move at a slow, consistent pace.

Hold the can of varnish parallel to the surface at the distance recommended by the manufacturer.

Begin at a far top corner just off the artwork, and spray horizontally across the surface, continuing off the other side of the artwork. Then spray the back across again, continuing in an even, side-to-side motion. With each pass, try to slightly overlap the area you just sprayed by about one-third until you have covered the entire surface.

Wait a minute for the solvents to evaporate off the surface. Spray the next coat in a vertical, up-and-down motion instead of going from side to side. Changing directions with each coat creates an even finish.

Many of us have to consider which kind of varnish we would use, spray or brush on.

According to this article the spray-on won't change the look of your original brushstrokes on the surface. It has quicker drying time and it applies evenly.

It is always interesting to read articles that teach or support the techniques you use. I find reading some of these older painting books give you that good feeling of, "I do that!" or "I can do that!"

I am now taking reservations for your table at the holiday boutique. Tables are \$35 for two days plus 10% of sales. The dates are: Friday, Oct. 27 from 9 to 4 and Saturday, Oct. 28 from 9 to 3. Set-up is Thursday, Oct. 26 from 4 to 7. It's fun and a great way to make a little money and share our love of painting. You can also rent a half a table. We sell all kinds of things at our boutique-it just has to be hand made by you, so if you have another talent we'd love to see it. We reserve tables for members thru July and start renting to non-members in August.

We hold the boutique at the Community Church at Jess Ranch on Apple Valley Rd, A.V. Rosanne and I will be happy to answer any questions and help in any way we can. **New painters are always welcome.**

We can set up or take down for you as long as we know in advance. We hope you all will take at least half a table-we send out over 600 flyers to our customers plus advertise in the Daily Press so we have the customers now we need to fill their needs!! So start painting two of whatever you paint and you'll be ready in no time. Come join us. You can call with your reservation, sign-up at the July meeting or e-mail us.
